Local Venues No.14 Local Trees

Christmas is nearly here and members of the Village Committee and volunteers will be out in the cold weather decking the village with trees and lights. I'm sure more help would be appreciated, especially from younger residents.

Near the village County Boundary stands a Lonesome Pine, a remnant of Whorls Wood. A huge Beech tree stood near the Clow, chopped down almost secretly and replaced by a depressive dark Copper Beech, they stick out like sore thumbs. A gnarled stump of a pollarded Crack Willow, possibly part of a pack horse basket that landed on the ground; in a Gill leans an attractive Large Leafed Lime, very fragrant, a Sweet Chestnut was cut down in exchange for a horse, in Autumn sprouted branches bear long bronze leaves.

The pair of weather trees, Oak and Ash, planted by J W Hartley still stand; also a row of ancient Oaks, said to be the last of Sutton Forest. Near the oldest dated building is a beautiful in all season Horse Chestnut. In the Park are red, white and yellow flowered Chestnuts. First to come into leaf in the Park, the only one in the village, is a Balsam Poplar, also fragrant, which is being strangled by Ivy, even though two years ago advice from the head forester of Craven Estate was given by me to the Parish Council.

On the Royds the very tall Poplars have been replaced by a smaller variety. Two Walnut trees, possibly given by the Girls' Brigade, have been planted in the Park. A young Monkey Puzzle tree, donated by the Conservation Group, entering the Clough, soon disappeared. It may not have done him any good! A Hawthorn Hedge in the woodland is grossly overgrown; at one time the Park Keeper trimmed it to a yard high. It is now an eerie place to pass by, light does not reach the woodland floor, undergrowth has gone with very little light for plants, nesting sights, small mammals and the once abundant fungi, Bluebells and pollinating insects.

Finally, I have often wondered if the owner of the Victoria Plum Tree in the centre of the old village ever harvests the plums!

Happy Christmas to readers of my column, residents and voluntary workers; and thank you for the many kind compliments and reminiscences to me.

Once again we would like to alert Elderly and Vulnerable People, do be aware there seems to be no end to the methods Crooks are using to part us from our hard earned cash. The latest scam is that you receive a card posted through your door from a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service) suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel and you must contact them on 0906 6611911 (a premium rate number) DO NOT CALL this number, as it is a mail scam originating from Belize. If you call this number and you hear the beginning of a recorded message you will already have been billed £15 for the phone call. If you receive a card with these details, please contact ICSTIS (the Premium Rate Service Regulator). We are passing on this message from Help The Aged.
A recent survey conducted by Northumbrian Water found that less than 23% of Elderly People are drinking the recommended amount of water per day, which is 8 glasses. This does seem a lot but do keep trying - the benefits are worthwhile.
Winter Fuel Payments are now in the process of being paid. Do be sure you are registered and receive yours.
